AHPS Helps Saint Margaret Mercy Salute Breast Cancer Awareness

American Heritage personnel stationed at Saint Margaret Mercy Healthcare Centers in Dyer, IN had the privilege of attending to the security needs of Ann Jillian, famed star of television, screen and stage. Jillian visited the hospital October 12 to give a motivational speech addressing her battle with breast cancer. About 300 people were in attendance for Jillian's unique, inspirational and comedic presentation.

Jillian was diagnosed with breast cancer during the peak of her career twenty years ago. The actress initially ignored doctor recommendations to get a biopsy, which resulted in the cancer spreading to both breasts. Jillian had to then undergo a radical double mastectomy and treatments of chemotherapy.

After emerging victorious in her battle against cancer, Jillian continued her career in the spotlight, most notably playing herself in the 1988 NBC made-for-TV movie about her survival called "The Ann Jillian Story."

Jillian's positive message of faith and hope resonated throughout the hospital and smiles were seen on all in attendance. Jillian treated the audience to a wonderful rendition of "Wind Beneath My Wings" before taking her final bow for the evening.

Safety Rules and Reminders

- ✓ Security personnel have to practice safety at all times. Client safety rules or standards must be followed. In addition, you may be asked to enforce client safety rules.
- ✓ Some facilities may provide special personal protective equipment for security personnel. If this equipment is supplied at your facility it must be worn as required.
- ✓ Every work related injury or accident must be immediately reported to your supervisor. It is important that every injury be reported regardless of how minor the injury may initially appear. Document all accidents and injuries fully and accurately.
- ✓ Security personnel should always report unsafe acts or unsafe working conditions to their supervisors. Every time an officer sees or becomes aware of anything that could be a safety hazard or cause an accident, remember that it's their duty to report it. Examples of safety hazards can be anything from steps that are slippery, worn or broken to areas which are not sufficiently lighted.



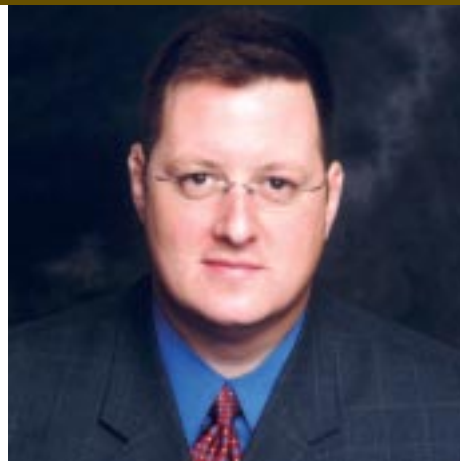
House Speaker Hastert Visits Museum Campus
